OVC Snapshot

We last wrote a newsletter in October. What's been happening since then?

- Our Corps Members have been offering over 450 hours of service every week at a dozen different nonprofits in Boston and Pittsburgh
- Our Corps Members have directly engaged a dozen Orthodox parishes.
- Over 20 guest speakers have contributed to our weekly formation seminars-from renowned Orthodox theologians to local leaders running high-impact nonprofits.
- 30 young adults have participated in our part-time program, OVC Reach.
- We hired a third staff member (see the feature below).
- We held our midyear retreat at St Basil Academy (see p. 3).
